

Fayette County School Board Candidate Questions

1. (A) Release from Desegregation Suit. Return School District to local control.

(B) Revamp Organization Structure, remove all positions not required by State law. Use savings to improve learning and pay teachers.

(C) Return control and accountability to building level. This will hold principals and teachers accountable for discipline and learning.
